Educational Programs for Gifted & Talented Students

- * K- 12 grade students are eligible for nomination, and once nominated, an overview of the assessment process is offered to parents.
- *Program options enable gifted/talented students to work together as a group, and work independently during the school day as well as the entire school year.
- *Students at all grade levels are involved in experiences that result in the development of sophisticated products and /or performances. Opportunities are provided for students to pursue areas of interest in selected disciplines through guided and independent research.
- *Teachers who provide instruction and services that are a part of the program for gifted students have a minimum of thirty (30) hours of GT training and; Teachers who provide instruction and services to gifted and talented students receive a minimum of six (6) hours annually of professional development in gifted education.
- *Parents are informed of all gifted/talented services and opportunities. The campus provides orientation and updates for parents of students identified and served in gifted programs through parent meetings.



Wellness & Physical Education

- *Each first grade class will receive instruction on dental health.
- *Each Kinder class will receive a class a hand-washing hygiene.
- *Campuses provide up to 135 225 minutes weekly of structured moderate to vigorous physical activity.
- *Fitnessgram Assessment is conducted with all students in P.E. grade 3-5. Assessment conducted to obtain Pre & Post information, which is available to parents upon request.
- *2nd Grade students participate in a two week "Learn to Swim" session that teaches fundamentals of swimming.
- *2nd Grade students participate in the RadKids program that focuses on bully prevention, physical resistance strategies against abduction, internet safety, personal touch and personal space safety, along home/school/out and about safety.
- *3rd, 4th and 5th Grade students participate in "Elementary Sports Games scheduled by Physical Education personnel.
- *1st – 5th grade students participate in fundamentals of tennis activities through a 2 week span.
- *Employees have access to participate in healthy life style as well as Health screening, training, and online resources.
- *School nurses will monitor campus immunization records and perform state mandated vision, hearing, and Spinal screenings.
- *Each campus will hold a flu vaccine clinic at their campus. Flu vaccines are provided by the Texas Vaccines For Children program through the City of Laredo Health Department



21st Century Workforce Development Program

- * Campus has events that bring career information to the majority of students. Speakers periodically visit classrooms to provide career information to the students.
